
Through purposeful collaboration, we foster thinking, responsible, and caring individuals who learn with self-awareness and intent.

Action

It is a genuine student initiative that grows out of their learning, driven by the desire to make a change or improvement.

Agency

Agency means that the student is an active participant in the learning process — they make choices, think critically, reflect, and take action.

- **Voice** students are encouraged to express their opinions, ideas, and questions.
- Choice students are given the opportunity to choose how, what, and even when they learn (according to their level of maturity).
- Ownership students feel that they have ownership of their learning.





The MYP programme teaches students to understand the connection between their learning and the global context.

Global contexts

- Identities and relationships (what it means to be a human)
- Orientation in space and time (personal histories and civilization)
- Personal and cultural expression (ways people express themselves)
- Scientific and technical innovation (impact on lives and environments)
- Globalization and sustainability (interconnectedness of human made systems and environment)
- Fairness and development (rights and responsibility)

The six global contexts of the MYP are reflected through the taught subjects, which develop students' skills and provide them with a broad foundation of knowledge.
